## Strategic Equality Plan 2017-18

Priority One: Reduce Gaps in attainment between pupils from protected groups

## Targets:

1. To build on the improving trend in boys performance at KS4 L2 threshold including **English & Mathematics** to continue to narrow the gap in gender performance in 2018, with particular focus on L2 English where the gap was >20% in 2016 and >12% in 2017

L2I boys 59.3% (62.6% 2016) girls 64.6% (72.2% 2016)

L2 English boys 62.9% (65.6% 2016); girls 75.2% (86.2% 2016)

NB In 2017 changes meant only English Language counted, there was a new specification in maths and numeracy was examined for the first time.

- 2. To further reduce the gap in KS4 Core Subject Indicator performance, where girls outperformed boys by >10%.2016 > 4% 2017
  - CSI boys 59.3% (62.6% in 2016) girls 64.6% (72.2% in 2016)
- 3. Further improve the performance of KS3 boys to reduce the 4.6% 2017 (12.2% in 2016) gap in L6+ English
- 4. To monitor performance of girls in science where the KS3 L6+ 9.7% gender gap in favour of boys in 2016 was reduced to 1.2% in 2017
